SUMMARY:

→ Gender inequality is particularly common when it comes to the field of education. The stereotypical thinking of society that women are born to babysit and look after the house leads to increased illiteracy in women particularly in rural areas. Furthermore, the educational scheme for women being unsatisfactory and non-purpose oriented curriculum leads to their non employment. The role of society in providing equal job opportunities to them is also futile. Women are deprived of their fundamental human rights of owning property and economic freedom. Their role and contribution in labour force is also not to talk of. Our country provides them with lowest share of labour income. Measures and remedies are necessary to be worked out for the eradication of this vice.
